OCCEDB Responsibilities

- Management of Circuit Engineering District (CED) Revolving fund and Emergency Transportation Revolving (ETR) fund.
- Management of Solid Waste Program from Department of Environmental Quality.
- Management of Governor's Repurposing Cross Town Beams program.
- Engineering support and research for CEDs/counties.
- Provide training workshops to County Commissioners.



OCCEDB Responsibilities, cont'd

- Participate in civic groups and other public meetings concerning transportation issues.
- Legislative research/information/support for counties/District Attorneys Offices.
- Facilitate CED's county equipment auctions.
- Provide county infrastructure information via ODOT's web portal.
- Partnering with ODOT on IIJA grants.

 - 25 million transferred from ODOT.

 Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant, STBG, roadway program oversight moved from ACCO to OCCEDB. FY 2020 moved to CEDs.

 Solid Waste Program moved from ACCO to OCCEDB.



CED Revolving Fund – Revenue Sources

- Gasoline Tax, 1/3 of 1%
 - Going into State's General Revenue Fund from Counties' apportionment.

2006

 Interest on County Bridge and Road Improvement, CBRI, Fund

2006

- Going into State's General Revenue Fund when CBRI fund was still with the State.
- Interest on Emergency and Transportation Revolving Fund

2010

 2014 Legislature transferred 10 million out to balance State's budget.



CED Revolving Fund – Revenue Sources

 12.5% of County Bridge and Road Improvement, CBRI, Fund

2010

- Majority, 87.5%, of the CBRI fund returned directly to counties.
- Plus a one-time, 1% of existing counties' CBRI balance apportioned to CEDs by member county's CBRI balance.
- Solid Waste Program Administration Fee.



CED Revolving Fund - Revenue Sources


- Gasoline Tax
 - Includes 1/3 of 1%
 - Includes 12.5% of gas tax going into CBRI Fund
- Diesel Tax
 - Includes 12.5% of diesel tax going into CBRI.
- Gross Production Tax on Oil
 - Includes 12.5% of oil tax going into CBRI.
- Interest earned on ETR fund balance
- Solid Waste Program Administration fee

State Gasoline Tax Apportionments FY 2022




Total: \$ 370,576,303 (@ 19 cents/gal & 5 cents on CNG/LNG)

State Diesel Tax Apportionments FY 2022




Total: \$ 181,023,519 (@ 19 cents/gal)

Additional Gas/Diesel Fuel Tax Apportionments SFY 2022





State Gross Production (Oil) Tax Apportionments FY 2022







CED Revolving Fund, FY 2021




CED Revolving Fund, FY 2022







CED Revolving Fund Revenues FY 2022














OCCEDB Budget / Expenses

- Budget FY 2023 = \$599,100 (\$192,000 IIJA grant application costs)
- Funded first by <u>ETR interest</u>, <u>Carryovers</u>, Solid Waste Administration Fee, and the initial <u>gasoline tax</u> (2006).
 - Carryover 2022 = \$0
 - Solid Waste Administration Fee = \$35,000/yr,
 Monthly disbursed



CED Revolving Fund Revenues


CBRI Portion - Disbursements by CR Factor

Disbursements by Number of Counties per CED



Solid Waste Program

- Contract with the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality, DEQ.
 - 2023 Total Contract \$655,000
 - Administrative Fee \$35,000
- FY 2023, overall 49 counties awarded funding; with 3 districts awarded trash cop, 9 districts awarded chippers, 75 districts awarded for roll-off dumpsters, 46 districts awarded chainsaws.



- Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant, STBG,
 Program funds of 6 million dollars per year.
- Manage construction plan until 2020 after which the funds will be apportioned to each CED on a pro-rata share.

Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act

- Each CED provided \$24,000, \$192,000 total, for grant application's expenses.
 - ODOT is cost matching 50% up to \$200,000.
- ACCO Transportation Committee formed with representation from each CED.
 - Focusing initially on Rural Surface Transportation and Bridge Investment Program grants.
 - Committee will make project recommendations to OCCEDB.
- ODOT recommended the consultant firm, Garver.
 - Reviewing projects in the current CIRB 5-year plan, not letting in current FY, NEPA process started, and meet the grants' qualifications.
 - ODOT is paying 100% of this cost.
